- Add the following supplies to your emergency kit: 1. Rock salt or more environmentally safe products to melt ice on walkways. 2. Sand to improve traction. 3. Snow shovels and other snow removal equipment. 4. Sufficient heating fuel. You may become isolated in your home and regular fuel sources may be cut off. 5. Adequate clothing and blankets
- Make a Family Communications Plan. Your family may not be together when disaster strikes, so it is important to know how you will contact one another, how you will get back together and what you will do in case of an emergency.
- Sign up in advance to receive notifications from your local emergency services.
- Minimize travel. If travel is necessary, keep a disaster supplies kit in your vehicle.
- Bring pets/companion animals inside during winter weather.
